Course Description:

This course will explore the structure of research methods and assess the skills needed to conduct graduate level research. The course is designed to guide the student through the process of planning, conducting, and reporting a successful graduate project.

Course Objectives:

After completion of the course, students should be able to plan, conduct, and report on a research project as appropriate to the field:

1. Understand the role of research.
1. Generate a research question.
3. Conduct a literature review.
4. Write an introductory chapter.
5. Write methods materials for assessment chapter.
2. Generate and analyze potential implications and results.
7. Generate and analyze potential discussions and conclusions.
0. Generate future work and impacts of their work.

Instructional Methods:

Each lecture will be a week. Class will be in a review of the previous class topic and an open question session.

Proposal (edit):

There will be a series of classes that will be measured based on the completion of a research proposal and the successful oral presentation of this proposal document.

Elements of the document may include: (Research, Literature, Materials and Methods, Applications, Potential results, discussions and conclusions) and a final presentation. Each element of the proposal must be clearly defined.

Student Conduct
